You need to know how to tell time to five minutes (for example, ten past three or twenty to seven). If you master that, can you convert between analogue times and digital times?</p>

For example, the Titanic set sail on Mrs Blake's birthday (date NOT year, I'm not that old!) I might choose to do a whole topic on the Titanic or I could choose to do a topic on the lead singer of Radiohead, Thom Yorke, who was born in Wellingborough.</p>
