- How do you think the character to the left is feeling?


Phonics- Revision of the 'IGH' sound. Practice writing the following words using your sound buttons (dots and dashes).

Challenge: Can you choose three words and put them into sentences?

For example: The loud bang gave the shopkeeper a fright.

English – Writing a story using 'suspense'. Suspense is used in writing to build tension, scare the reader or keep the reader wanting to find out what is going to happen next. For example:



Your job is to write the next part of the story, once Lottie turns the doorknob. What is going to be on the other side of the door? Is she going to meet someone? Is she about to enter a mysterious adventure? Use your imagination.






Questions:

6. How many pieces of fruit are there altogether?



Ice Escape

You will need:




1 yoghurt pot



a figurine



water



A freezer

Method:

1. Fill the yoghurt pot just over halfway.
2. Pop the figurine into the pot.
3. Make sure the figurine is completely covered by the water.
4. Pop the yoghurt pot into the freezer.
5. When it has frozen, fill the rest of the pot with water and pop it back into the freezer.
6. When it has completely frozen, take the ice block out of the yoghurt pot. You might need some help.
7. Now you need to decide how you will get the figurine out of the ice.



The Science

Ice forms when water is cooled down to 0 degrees Celsius. The little water particles, called molecules, cool down. Now they have become ice. This process is called freezing. When you want to turn ice into water we call this process melting. This is the reverse process of freezing.

Key questions for the investigation:

- What would be the quickest way to get the figurine out of the ice?
- What would be the slowest way to get the figurine out of the ice?
- What equipment could you use to get the figurine out of the ice?
- Do you think the ice cube will melt quickly when it is out of the freezer? Why?
