Writing – Punctuating simple sentences correctly

It is very important that in Year 2 we can use full stops and capital letters correctly. This means that we can write simple sentences using capital letters and full stops so our sentences make sense.

A sentence is a group of words which are connected to each other and it makes sense by itself. Sentences should always start with a capital letter and end with a full stop.

For example: **T**he lady is using a trolley to carry her food**!**

We should always remember that any names or places within our sentence should also have a capital letter.

For example: **S**arah dreamed about her trip to **I**taly**!**

Now let's check that we have everything we need. In the first example, we have used a capital letter to start the sentence and full stop to finish the sentence. On the second example we have used capital letters for the name and the place as well as a full stop at the end of the sentence.

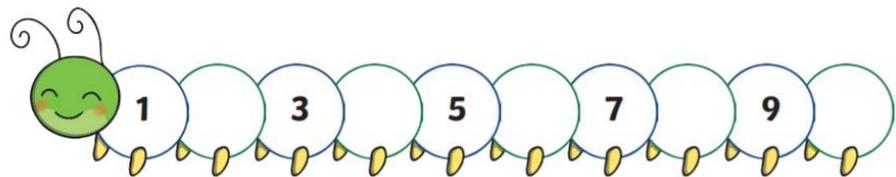
Maths – Odd and even numbers

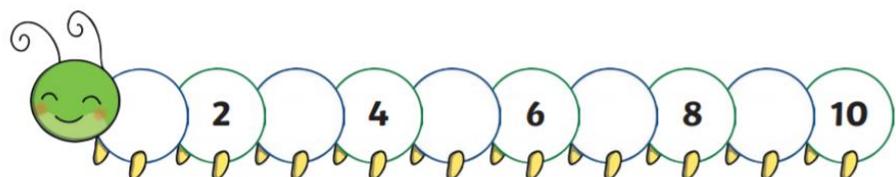
