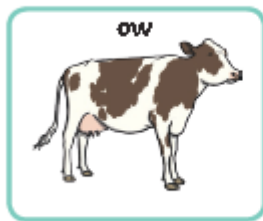

The /ow/ sound, as in 'cow', can be made by using 'ow' or 'ou'.



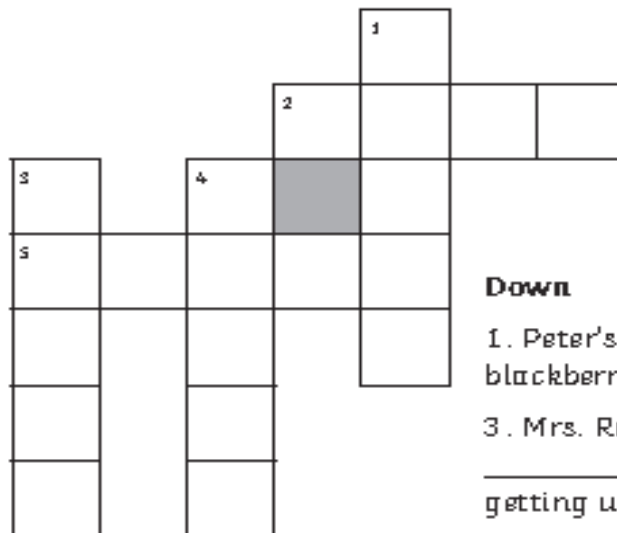
