



Topic


Design your own flag to represent you and your family. Think carefully about what each of the colours mean and the shapes that you use on your flag.

- Green: New Beginnings, Abundance, Nature.
- Blue: Calm, Responsible, Sadness.
- Purple: Creativity, Royalty, Wealth.

The flag below could mean happiness and wealth with the yellow and purple background.

The blue moon represents the calmness like the sea and the skies.
