Writing - Setting descriptions

Today we are going to deliver the children's writing lesson in a slightly different way. We are going to be using a website that has been used before called 'Oak National Academy'. This website offers individual lessons which are delivered to the students by a teacher using clips. It uses a step by step process and it is a great way to get the children involved in the learning of the lesson which is delivered similarly to how we would teach within our classrooms.



Features of a Setting Description

Before you start the lesson you will need a piece of paper and a pencil. Once you have clicked on the link, you should skip the video to 7 minutes. In this lesson, we are going to be learning about setting descriptions. We will be identifying three different features in a given text which are things the children have already learnt about in Year 2; commas in a list, expanded noun phrases and adverbs.


Geography – The seven continents
