Phonics/ Spelling- Adding s or es

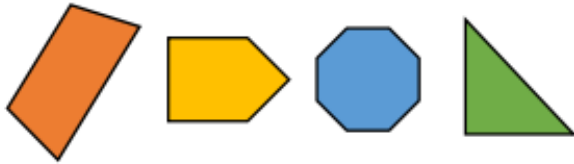
Look at the words below and decide if you add s or es to the root word. Highlight the one you think is correct.
